GETTING STARTED

Where is the documentation for the EVOLVE library?

The manual can be found in the Heavyocity/Evolve/Documentation folder, or it can be downloaded from the Heavyocity website.

How do I get Adobe Reader?

For windows, you can download the PDF reader from the Adobe website:

For Mac OS X, the application entitled "Preview" can read the PDF documentation. Simply double click on the PDF Manual.

Why is there no printed manual?

All of us here at Heavyocity are environmentally conscientious. By not printing physical manuals, we are able to do our part in helping to conserve. Additionally, the costs that were saved by not printing the manuals have allowed us to keep the price of the instrument as low as possible. The manual is readily available as a PDF, and can be found in the Heavyocity/Evolve/Documentation folder, or at the downloads section of the Heavyocity website.

How do I install the EVOLVE software?

Insert DVD disc 1 and double-click the installer. You will be prompted from there to follow the installation steps. After disc 1 has finished, insert disc 2 and copy the Evolve_003.nkx file to the Heavyocity/Evolve folder. Where is the serial number located for installation/authorization?

It is affixed to the inside of the DVD case, directly above the discs.

How do I authorize EVOLVE?

EVOLVE can be authorized through the Native Instruments Service Center. Service Center is installed on your system through the EVOLVE installer. To launch NI Service Center on a Mac, navigate to the Service Center folder in your Applications folder. On a PC, navigate to the Service Center folder in your program files. Once the Service Center is launched, create a username and password (if you do not already have one) and click next. In the following window, you will see a list of products awaiting authorization. Select the box next to Heavyocity Evolve, and click next. EVOLVE will now be permanently registered to your system.

****You can authorize EVOLVE on up to two computers at a time. If you need to transfer a registration to another computer, you can deactivate the old system via the Native Instruments online registration site. Please be aware that once a computer has been de-authorized, it can never be reauthorized. You can find the Native Instruments online registration site here:*

The installer seems to hang.

Upon installation, the installer may appear to “stall” or “hang”. Do not force quit the installation. It is actually in the process of copying all of the samples to your drive.

LICENSE AGREEMENT**What type of music productions can I use EVOLVE’s sounds on?**

When you purchase the license to use EVOLVE, you can use the instrument for all types of music productions. There are two exceptions. First, you may not use a single loop on its own and sell it as a new composition to be licensed for a music library. To avoid this, you must add two other elements (samples or loops) to avoid violating the license agreement. Second, no element from EVOLVE can ever be used to create a sample library or Virtual Instrument of any kind. For more information please refer to the EULA (End-User License Agreement). Helpful Hints:

Kontakt 2 and Kontakt 2 Player stream content Direct from Disk (DFD). Although this is not necessary, EVOLVE will tend to operate more efficiently when the library content (the samples) are installed on another physical hard drive. You can direct the installer to place the EVOLVE Library in any directory of your choice.
